

[THOMAS](#): The Library of Congress Internet Legislative Information System. Updated daily, it provides a searchable database for information about all bills passed in the 110th and 111th Congress, bills pending in Congress, and House and Senate floor speeches and debates recorded daily in the Congressional Record.

[Federal Departments, Bureaus, and Agencies](#): A comprehensive list of links to the homepages of federal organizations, from the CIA and the Social Security Administration to the Department of Commerce and the White House.

[USA.gov](#): Reach all federal websites from a single site.

[The Architect of the Capitol \(AOC\)](#): The official site maintained by the AOC, which provides historic and current information on the function and architecture of the U.S. Capitol Complex, including the Capitol, the Capitol Visitors Center, the congressional office buildings, the Library of Congress buildings, the Supreme Court building, the U.S. Botanic Garden, The Capitol Power Plant and other facilities.

[National Archives and Records Administration](#): Holds the records of the United States Federal government. On-line access to art works, census data, US legal manuscripts, the Federal Register and numerous other documents.

[Government Printing Office \(GPO\)](#): Provides free, searchable electronic access to a wealth of important information published by the federal government. The information provided on this site is the official version of government documents.

[Government Accountability Office \(GAO\)](#): Known as the "investigative arm of Congress," GAO supports the Congress in meeting the performance and accountability of the Federal government for the benefit of the American people.

[Congressional Budget Office \(CBO\)](#): Provides Congress with objective, nonpartisan, and timely analyses to aid in economic and budgetary decisions on the wide array of programs covered by the federal budget and Congressional budget process.

[Federal Citizen Information Center](#): Answers questions about the federal programs, benefits, or services, and everyday consumer issues.

[Independent Federal Agencies and Commissions](#): Independent establishments created by Congress to address concerns that go beyond the scope of ordinary legislation. These agencies are responsible for keeping the government and economy running smoothly.

[Library of Congress](#): The nation's oldest federal cultural institution that serves as the research arm of Congress. It is also the largest library in the world, with millions of books, recordings, photographs, maps and manuscripts in its collections.
