

Washington, DC -- U.S Representative Michael A. Arcuri (D-Utica) announced today that he will hold his second “Congress on your Corner” event in Utica on Saturday, February 24th. Arcuri will be available to meet with constituents and discuss problems local constituents are having with the federal government.
