

Washington, DC -- U.S Representative Michael Arcuri (D-Utica) will hold his first “Congress on your Corner” event in Norwich on Saturday, January 27th. Arcuri will be available to meet with constituents and discuss problems local constituents are having with the federal government. Mayor Joseph Maiurano and Police Chief Joseph G. Angelino will join Arcuri.
